“I” or “Me”



“I” is a subject pronoun. It is used when we refer to the ‘DOER’ of an action.

“ME” is an object pronoun. It is used when we refer to the ‘RECEIVER’ of action.



 Set yourself up for success!

- Step 1. Identify the ACTION.
- Step 2. Identify the DOER and RECEIVER.
- Step 3. Use ‘I’ if we are referring to the doer.
Use ‘me’ if we are referring to the receiver.



EXAMPLE.

Renee lent my classmate and _____ her new book.
Do-er Action Receivers

Since we are referring to the receivers, the answer is ‘me’!
